9:30am Worship. This Sunday we mark both Epiphany (Jan 6) and the Baptism of Jesus. "Epiphany" means "realization," a revelation or manifestation of God. This ancient festival falls on the 13th day of Christmastide, and celebrates "the sudden discovery of who Jesus was and what his coming into the world meant for humanity." Epiphany is linked to the Gospel stories of the visit of the Magi, the baptism of Jesus, and the wedding at Cana. (from amnetwork.uk).

While some of it may be review, we are aware that the work of inclusion is ongoing and everchanging and all of us have more to learn.

Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery Worship Series (Jan 15-Feb 12). As of January 5, Elkhart County is at "Medium" COVID-19 Community Level. The CDC recommends wearing a high-quality mask (e.g. N95) when you are indoors with high-risk individuals. Please consider wearing a mask in worship to help protect high-risk individuals worshiping with us.

Masks are optional during worship & Sunday school, unless Elkhart County's Community Risk Level becomes "High" – in which case masks will be required indoors for everyone over age 2. We encourage everyone to stay up to date on vaccinations and boosters, and encourage anyone who is not feeling well to join us on Zoom.

While many in our faith family are thankful masks are no longer required, a fair number of us feel the need to be even more careful when at church, and some are deciding to return to joining worship by Zoom. Parents should contact Sunday school teachers directly if they are sending kids to Sunday school during days 6 through 10 after a positive COVID test. During this time children are asked to wear a mask during Sunday school and sit apart from the group during snack.
