Assembly recently joined <u>a coalition of Anabaptist groups and congregations committed to the cause of Dismantling the Doctrine of Discovery: a historic and ongoing legal/philosophical framework that gave Christian governments moral and legal rights to invade and seize Indigenous lands and dominate Indigenous Peoples. <u>For the complete series introduction click here</u>. Our preacher this morning is Dr. Joëlle Morgan, who teaches at the University of Ottawa in education and at St. Paul University in theology and transformative leadership. Her dissertation focused on liberation theologies in Indigenous-settler relations.</u>

In Elkhart County, Indiana, the $\underline{\text{COVID-19 Community Level}}$ is $\boldsymbol{\text{Low}}.$


Please join on Zoom if you are feeling sick.
