#### CARNIVAL SUNDAY

On Carnival Sunday Feb. 19th we will bring our seeking, exploring selves—full of knowledge about the ways the world has been colonized and claimed—and begin the work of turning toward Lent. But we will ask along the way: What have we missed in our seeking, where have we been blinded, what was there all along that we missed, and what is yet to be unveiled? Carnival gives us the opportunity to use humor, care, and attention to name those things that are sometimes hard to see, to use laughter to build community, and to honestly look at the ways our seeking sometimes misses the mark.

Come to Carnival expecting an intergenerational Sunday morning event that is something between a circus, a party, and regular worship. Assembly's tradition at Carnival is to use laughter, humor, and play to make space for the transforming work of the Holy Spirit. We exaggerate in safe company that which we usually try to hide. Children and grown-ups are encouraged to come in costume (which could be something as simple as a small, symbolic accessory—or feel free to go all out!).
