9:30am Worship. Click here for Order of Worship. Today is the first Sunday of Lent. This year we're using a Lenten series created by A Sanctified Art. This series is founded on questions. Many of the questions feel restorative ("Can these bones live?"). Some feel like a charge or challenge ("Who will you listen to?"). Some questions are hopeful and curious ("How do we begin again?"). Our questions won't necessarily lead to answers, but they can help us find clarity and a new perspective. Ultimately, we pray they lead to a new beginning, a restoration, a wider grace. Second hour. There are three opportunities to engage in second hour:

- Anabaptist Bible Study: Multipurpose North. A group of women here at Assembly have been supplying pads, tampons and cleansing cloths to Goshen public schools, NIJC and First Light Mission. If you'd like to help, please put your products in the tub beneath the mailboxes. We currently have no supplies. We are glad for the products anytime; we need lots of products by March 5 to fulfill these requests. Please buy unscented products that are individually wrapped. Pads are used more than tampons. Thin pads, all sizes but without wings, are preferred. We also distribute personal cleansing cloths, again unscented, and new panties in school girls' sizes. In Elkhart County, Indiana, the COVID-19 Community Level is Low.

Please join on Zoom if you are feeling sick.

Masks are optional during worship & Sunday school, unless Elkhart County's Community Risk Level becomes "High" – in which case masks will be required indoors for everyone over age 2. We encourage everyone to stay up to date on vaccinations and boosters, and encourage anyone who is not feeling well to join us on Zoom.

Parents should contact Sunday school teachers directly if they are sending kids to Sunday school during days 6 through 10 after a positive COVID test. During this time children are asked to wear a mask during Sunday school and sit apart from the group during snack.
