The Psalms teach us the language of lament, so that when our own storms come we have the vocabulary to cry out. The Psalms give us space to voice our longings, to protest and to proclaim that "things are not as they should be." But lament without praise withers our faith. By praising God for who God is and what God has done and is doing, we dethrone the false Gods vying for our loyalty. How might the Psalms help us as a community to re-orient ourselves after the disorienting years of the pandemic? For the full series introduction, click here.

Gift cards are untraceable. 3) Someone you have not met in person asks for money for something, even if they sound like a nice person. Con artists are great at building trust. 4) They want you to act quickly. They don't give you time to think.
