**Second hour** There are three options to participate in 2<sup>nd</sup> hour:

- Some Assembly Required—west side of MP North. Some Assembly Required is across from room 12.
- Worship Training Elective—Worship space. Join the worship committee for a hands-on worship elective. Learn to lead worship, lead singing, and plan a worship service. Intended for beginners or experienced folks who want to get better!

# **BIRTHDAYS**





Pastoral Transition: Please read the letter from Lora that was sent out on the listserv earlier this week.

**Congregational Meeting May 21**: Plan to join this month's congregational meeting Sunday May 21 at 7pm, in person at the meetinghouse. Agenda items will include affirmation of <u>the slate of Committees and Positions for 2023-2024</u>, responding to a recently completed Accessibility Audit at Assembly, and the upcoming launch of a Capital Campaign to pay down the mortgage.

**Elder selection:** Assembly's new elder-selection process has each small group nominate potential elders, and later determine whether those nominated are well-qualified and a good fit for this time. In Elkhart County, Indiana, the <u>COVID-19 Community Risk Level</u> is **Low**. Please join on Zoom if you are feeling sick.
