The Two Percent Committee met June 4 and agreed to make the following disbursements. If you have concerns, please contact a member of the committee: Barb Swartley, Glenn Gilbert, Joel Zwier and Marshall King. Center for Community Justice VORP \$1,000, CAPS (Child and Parent Services) \$500, Cora Dale House (Elkhart County Clubhouse) \$1,000, Mosaic Health and Healing Arts \$1,000, Safety Networks \$1,000, Bushelcraft Farm \$1,500, Association for a More Just Society \$500, Community Peacemaker Teams \$1,000, Jubilee Partners \$1,000, Mennonite Central Committee \$1,500, Tanzania Education Aid \$1,000, SEMILLA \$1,000. Maria Wenger (Parkside) was awarded a grant of \$170.75 from the public school funds for a mobile dry erase board. Almost \$900 remains in this fund to be used before school starts. Public school teachers are invited to submit funding requests here. The Two Percent Committee places a priority on giving to agencies doing work of relief and reparations that have a direct link to people who are part of our congregation. We take specific requests and recommendations seriously.
