FINANCIAL LIFE AT ASSEMBLY

Capital Campaign 2024 - Thanks to your generous giving over the last four years, we have only \$132,200 left to pay on our Everence mortgage! Let's celebrate by paying off this entire amount by May 2024, as we celebrate Assembly's 50th anniversary! We invite everyone to give what they can, above and beyond your regular giving. Two Percent Committee met August 27. Just over \$9000 of Two Percent offerings has been set aside for distribution by The Reparation Committee. After Two Percent has distributed \$52,000, all funds will go to reparations. (What is the 2% Fund?)

Reparations Committee: As mentioned above, approximately \$9000 has already been provisioned by the congregation from our Two Percent fund to be distributed locally for reparations. The Reparations Committee has decided to pay on the debt for past harm to the local Black community by sending \$9,000 to the Tolson Center for Community Excellence in southcentral Elkhart for use as they choose. We will learn more about this important work on Sunday, September 24, during worship and during second hour when Cyneatha Millsaps, the Tolson Board Chair, will be worshiping with us as the preacher. The Reparations Committee is continuing to determine the payment partners in the Indigenous community.
