*Who is Sovereign?* Our next set of texts include stories from throughout the history of Israel and Judah. These stories wrestle with the politics of living together and the brokenness of human society. Throughout all of these stories, we are called to wonder: Where is God in this? Who is Sovereign? Is it the God of Abraham, Isaac and Judah, or is the real Lord some other power?

In this series, we will wrestle with some of the same questions in our own lives: who is Lord and Sovereign of our world today? We'll explore where God's *hesed* (steadfast love) shows up, how she works actively in human history, and how we, like the children of Israel, respond to her in sometimes surprising ways.

## CHURCH FINANCES

**AMC Financial Update.** As of Sept 30, actual expenses for the year exceed our offerings by about \$39,000. **We need \$58,000 in offerings each month in October, November, and December in order to meet our anticipated expenses.** The congregation's spending has been higher than anticipated this year because of inflation, travel costs for the MCUSA Convention in July, and maintenance issues.
