There are a number of ways you can take action in support of a ceasefire in Palestine (in order from least to highest commitment):

- Sign a petition with hundreds of other US Mennonites calling on our federal representatives to support a permanent ceasefire. Click here for the petition
- Join the **Slack Channel** where folks can meet each other and keep up to date for the most recent movement/plans from Menno Action. Click here to join the Slack channel
- Action Hours: On Tuesdays and Thursdays Mennonite Action will hold action hours where they will call our representatives together, as a Mennonite community. We encourage you to join as many of these action hours as you're able, as our representatives need to continue to hear from us.
- On January 16th, hundreds of Mennonites will gather in Washington DC to peacefully demonstrate for a
 permanent ceasefire. Together, we will show our political leaders, our fellow community members, and our
 Palestinian, Jewish, Arab and Muslim loved ones that there are Christians and Mennonites who stand with them
 in their call for peace and a ceasefire now. We will bring this petition with us, to demonstrate that thousands of
 Mennonites from across the United States stand together for a permanent ceasefire and an end to occupation.
 As soon as details are worked out, they'll be posted on MennoAction's website.
