8:00am Messiah orchestra rehearsal Instrumentalists of all abilities are welcome, especially our youth. Please bring a music stand if you have one and plan to play with the orchestra.

9:30am Worship. The Order of Worship can be read here. This is the first Sunday of Advent. Our narrative lectionary texts for this season are all related to God's promises, promises that God makes to people during times of uncertainty. Can God's promises be trusted? Are new beginnings coming? The prophets remind us that especially in uncertain and disorienting times, God promises to rebuild, restore, and redeem. Read the introduction and calendar here.

2nd hour Messiah sing Join us for Second Hour for this annual tradition, bring your own Messiah score if you have it. Children through 4th grade will have Sunday school as usual and then join in the end of the Messiah singing. 5th grade and above will be with parents/mentors and participating in the Messiah singing.

Potluck. Following the Messiah Sing there will be a potluck. Please bring a dish (or two) to share, and plates and utensils for your household. The Hospitality Committee requests that households with names beginning with A through L bring a main dish, and M through Z bring a side or salad. Everyone should feel free to bring a dessert in addition. If you prefer to bring something different than requested that's fine; what's important is to have plenty of all types of food, especially as we anticipate hosting additional visitors because of the Messiah sing.
