COVID-19 UPDATE

COVID-19 Risk Level and CDC Recommended Precautions - UPDATE: The Elkhart County Hospital Admission Level has recently gone up to **Medium** for the first time since January 2023, with a 40% increase in new hospital admissions of confirmed COVID-19 cases according to the CDC.

The CDC recommends masking indoors in public for: those who are at high risk, those with household or social contact with someone at high risk (when indoors with them), and anyone with symptoms, a positive test, or exposure to someone with COVID-19. Anyone may choose to mask at any time.

At Assembly, we continue to meet for worship as usual, with **masks optional**. However, we encourage those who are at high risk to consider joining worship on Zoom. As always, please stay home and join us on Zoom if you have symptoms or a positive COVID-19 test. If you have been exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19 but do not have symptoms, please wear a mask in accordance with CDC guidelines if you choose to come to worship.

- On January 16th, hundreds of Mennonites will gather in Washington DC to peacefully demonstrate for a
 permanent ceasefire. Together, we will show our political leaders, our fellow community members, and our
 Palestinian, Jewish, Arab and Muslim loved ones that there are Christians and Mennonites who stand with them
 in their call for peace and a ceasefire now. We will bring this petition with us, to demonstrate that thousands of
 Mennonites from across the United States stand together for a permanent ceasefire and an end to occupation.
