Hearing assistance in our new worship space: Our new worship space now has two systems to help people with hearing loss participate more fully in our life together.

1. You may still use the familiar FM system. To use it, get a receiver and an ear speaker or headphones from the sound booth when you enter the worship space.
2. The new system is a Hearing Loop that you can access if your hearing aids have t-coils. To use it, find a seat in the worship space and turn on the t-coils in your hearing aids.

(You do not need a receiver, ear speaker or head phones.) You may need to try different seats for better reception.

Reserved signs have been placed on some chairs along the aisles in the new worship space. This is to mark chairs that have arms and have some extra space in front of them, so that people with walkers or otherwise limited mobility may be comfortable in this worship space. These signs do not imply that the whole row is reserved, but please leave the marked chairs on the end for those who need them.

This young woman needs housing and support in the areas of: finding work, transportation, moving towards financial independence, learning English, getting her driver's license, possibly counseling, finishing her GED, caring for her young son, and getting him enrolled in preschool or Head Start.
