Backyard house church needs you! Starting August 16 we'll be experimenting with six weeks of in-person neighborhood backyard house church worship. We are looking for two types of "host" for backyard house church from August 16-September 27: (1) backyard hosts, and (2) welcoming/logistics hosts. (1) We need backyards that are big enough to accommodate up to 6 households with physical distancing. You do not need to provide chairs or restrooms. Services will be less than an hour. (2) We also need people who are willing to serve as the "host" (could be the same as the backyard host but not necessarily) who are willing to welcome people, assign worship roles, and either print or pick up worship resources at the church. (3) For all who prefer not to gather in person, we'll still have participatory Zoom worship, so we will also require online hosts who feel comfortable using Zoom.
