Lent 2021 Deep Calls to Deep February 17-April 4



The season of Lent falls in the greyest part of the year in Northern Indiana. We are waiting for spring. The ground is lonely and exposed and Lent is the season that calls for our exposure. It is the "scrubbing away" of excess. It is the time when we are asked to look honestly and deeply at our relationships with God, with others and the earth. The call to go deep can be frightening or overwhelming, especially when we feel we are not ready and do not know what we will find; afterall, we keep much of our pain in our depths.

This year's theme "deep calls to deep" is not only about deep pain, it is also about deep belovedness. God's call echoes within the deep place within us, a place where the words of love, spoken to Jesus at his baptism, dwell: "you are my Beloved; with you I am well pleased." Enter into this season hearing the voice that urges you to see yourself as God sees you. Allow yourself to be led into deeper relationship with God and others. May you live and love deeply during this 40 day season of self-examination, surrender, and preparation.

As the liturgical season moves from Ashes to Resurrection, the season outside moves from winter to spring. So during this time, you are invited to pay attention to the natural world. The themes and scriptures for each week introduce images from nature: deep in the sea, the woods, the sky, the wilderness, the earth and the current. What learnings might we experience this season if we enter deeply into the wisdom of creation? **Each week, you are invited to send in your own images or artwork on the theme for a slideshow we'll use in worship.** Please send to <u>annay@assemblymennonite.org</u> by each Friday.

Another way you can enter into this season is by participating in weekly self guided "mini-retreats." The worship space will be set up with different stations that family groups or individuals can move through on Wednesday evenings (beginning Feb. 17) from 4-6 p.m. We will change the materials at each station according to the lectionary and the theme each week. There will be a pastor there during that time to offer a ritual blessing (ashes, oil, water, etc). These rituals are for all.

We are also encouraging households to use weekly prayer guides, available each week attached to the prayer and sharing, in hard copies in the worship space starting on Ash Wednesday, or here: <u>Prayer Booklet</u>

- Worship will be followed by two options for Second hour: "Visio Divina," led by Kyle Schlabach will be exploring the images from Voices Together in a contemplative way. "Podcast and Conversation" led by a rotating group of people will be discussion based.
